

CELEBRATION OF HOLY COMMUNION

(As you receive your Communion cup, you are invited to partake of the bread and juice as a sign of being members of the Body of Christ.)

INVITATION TO COMMUNION

Pastor Nick: This morning we once again gather to receive the bread and the cup. We are an "Open Communion" church, meaning that we require no specific creed or confession in order to participate in this meal. These are the gifts of God for the people of God, and all are welcome to participate.

Pastor Mary Jo: Today, we remember our sisters and brothers from above and below the equator, from the North and from Down Under, from every time zone around the globe. As today's sunlight inches across land and sea, Christians gather to celebrate their place in God's family. To God be the glory: great things God has done!

As we prepare to partake of this Holy Meal, let us pray: Loving God, we come before you broken, yet seeking wholeness; overwhelmed, yet seeking simplicity; shamed, yet seeking grace:

All: Merciful God, we yearn for the healing you promise.

Pastor Nick: God of Justice, we come before you: selfish, yet seeking a generous heart; responsible for injustices, yet seeking forgiveness:

All: Loving God, we yearn for the justice you promise.

Pastor Mary Jo: God of Peace, we come before you afraid, yet seeking assurance; agitated, yet seeking serenity:

All: Gracious God, we yearn for the peace you promise.

Pastor Nick: Knowing that through Christ all things are made new, we come to this Communion table to be re-created through the bread and cup, and to be renewed in our faith and commitment.

All: Forgiving God, we submit ourselves to renewal through you.

Pastor Mary Jo: Gracious God, who summons galaxies into being, we give thanks and praise to you. We thank you for the diversity of our planet, for the prairies and pampas of the Americas to the dusty deserts of Africa and Asia. We give you thanks for the multiplicity of humanity with our varieties of color and culture yet called into oneness of being through Christ. With many tongues, yet with one voice, we honor you saying:

All: Holy, holy God of power and might, the whole universe speaks of your glory, O God Most High. Blessed is He who comes in the name of our God! Hosanna in the highest!

WORDS OF REMEMBERING

Pastor Nick: On the night on which He was betrayed, and as they were sitting at a meal, Jesus took a piece of bread, blessed it, broke it, and said, "This is my body, broken and freely given for all of you."

Pastor Mary Jo: Later, after they had eaten, he took a cup, poured the wine and said: "This cup is a new covenant [soon to be poured out], in my blood, for the forgiveness of sins. All of you, drink of it."



Reminder: Our Ministry Plan for Program Year 2023-2024



For those of you who were on vacation or missed the "Council Corner" from July 23, here is a reminder of our plan that is unfolding for our ministry as we continue our Pastoral Search process.

The First Congregational United Church of Christ Church Council has approved a plan, created by church leadership in collaboration

with Pastor Nick for the Program Year, 2023-2024. This will allow us to provide familiar meeting and worship patterns, and hope-filled and honest communications while the Search Team continues its work to find a settled Senior Pastor.

The plan involves moving from a three-pastor to a short term two-pastor model. Pastor Nick, having seniority on the staff, will assume a leadership role which will be titled, "Temporary Head of Staff." During this short-term staffing model, Sarah Wilterdink will oversee all Children, Youth and Families activities as the Director of CYF. Pastor Nick will support Sarah in her position, as well as the rest of the staff, but will not be involved in the implementation or leadership of any CYF programs while he is the Temporary Head of Staff. No worries - he will continue to lead worship events such as Children's Messages, the Hanging of the Greens Service, etc. CYF programming and registration will be coming your way soon.

As we move forward...

- We will continue to have one service of Worship in-person and online.
- We will be using the Revised Common Lectionary for the program year with primary texts being taken from the Gospels.
- We will continue to utilize lay leadership for the scripture reading.

Pastor Mary Jo will continue to serve as our Interim Associate Pastor at least until the end of the program year. Throughout the year we will have opportunities to receive updates from the Senior Pastor Search Committee and from Church Council. Meantime, we are blessed to continue ministering with many active and gifted lay-leaders as we strive to continue to be The Church of the Open Door!

We commit ourselves through study and immersion experiences to learn the history and cultures of these peoples and their traditional knowledge.
