Open Manger

On this wondrous day what a blessing it is to gather as *The Church of the Open Door* to celebrate the birth of the Christ Child. We are so blessed that you have joined us today, that you have chosen to come worship here and receive today's message of hope. Your presence is truly a Christmas gift, just as you are a treasured child created in wonder by our loving God. In the Gospel of Luke, we read:

The shepherds said to one another, "Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us." So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. -Luke 2:15-16

Our prayer for you is that you would receive God's gift: that the open manger would become an untying of divine purpose and love, joy and hope. Likewise, our prayer for *The Church of the Open Door* is that we continue to be an inclusive, scripturally faithful and joy-filled people in all our ministries, fellowship, and worship.

Lastly, for many of us the holidays hold remembrances and grief, and we invite you to fill out a Prayer Request so we can hold you in prayer.
