

Dear Friends,

Since the first century, Christians have been waiting during the season of Advent for the True Light and uttered the word *Maranatha*, often translated "Our Lord, Come!" This word is a Greek translation of Aramaic and often appears as just one word - maranatha. But in Aramaic, it may be two words with two different meanings:

marana tha: a word oriented towards the future, translated as "Come, our Lord!" maran atha: a word oriented towards the completed past, translated as "Our Lord has come."

These two different words collide during Advent: when saying, "Our Lord has come," the remembrance of the God's gift of God's Son Jesus Christ meets our hopeful cry inviting the Christ child to come again when we say, "Come, Our Lord!" During Advent, beginnings and endings meet. We prepare ourselves, for four Sundays, to step forth into the celebration of the Word incarnate - Jesus Christ.

The gifts of hope, peace, love, and joy are the treasures we at First Congregational United Church of Christ wish to share with you during worship this season. We invite you to look at our worship services listed on the reverse side of this page.

In addition to being a part of our worship life, we hope that each of you will also remember the church in your Christmas giving. Enclosed you will find an envelope for use in our traditional Christmas offering. This offering helps the church in fulfilling its ministry in Christ's name, supporting the total programming of the church here and throughout the world. Please give prayerful consideration to this gift, that it may be one which sincerely reflects your gratitude to God for the gift of God's only begotten son.
