On Sunday, June 29, during the congregational meeting, a motion was put forth to: "Approve a Capital Campaign dedicated to the financing for the planning, construction, and implementation of the priorities determined by the Isaiah Project Team. The associated

fundraising shall take place over a three-year period. The execution of these projects shall not exceed the amount raised." This motion was unanimously approved by congregational vote.

After the meeting, our building and landscape architects presented the project plan. This plan, reflecting the priorities and goals of our vibrant life inside and outside the church walls, is scaffolded into four levels of funding with project priorities listed at each level of giving. The total amount of funds raised by our capital campaign will determine the number of priorities in the plan that are able to be accomplished.
