Admission is free but there will be an opportunity to make free will donations that will go directly to the Oneida Food Pantry.

New Membership Exploration Class: Are you new to First Congregational and want to learn more about our faith community? E2F (Empty to Full) Pans: On Sunday, **April 27**, First UCC will participate in a project to allow members to prepare pans of food, in their own home, primarily to serve Pillars, with a smaller number going to COTS & Apricity. All are serving homeless people. Willing participants can pick up an empty pan that contains the recipe & shopping list to prepare & fill the pan with an easy recipe. (Cost is approx. \$ 16.00) The recipes are so simple...no cooking or basic cooking required. This is a great activity for all ages and skills. (The pans are not baked; the shelter will do this.) The prepared pan is returned on Sunday, May 4, before the church service. If you're unable to bring the pan back on May 4, it can be placed in the church kitchen freezer the week before. Call the office to make sure the kitchen is open. If this doesn't work, please call Cindi MacSwain 920-606-6699.


References to God in our worship may at times be gender specific. You are invited to substitute terms that reflect your understanding of the inclusiveness of God.


