Notes from the composer: *Good Shepherd* was composed for William and Curt Sorensen, brothers and tenor soloists with the choir at the First Congregational Church of North Guilford, CT. Bill Sorensen raises sheep. Thus, the topic of the "Good Shepherd" seemed most appropriate. This anthem is based on the traditional hymn "The King of Love My Shepherd Is," with music and lyrics adapted by the composer. Interspersed with the preexisting material are short phrases, musical settings of lines from the Saint Patrick Breastplate: "God before me. God beside me. God behind me. God above me." The intent in combining these sources is to speak of God's presence guiding (as a "Good Shepherd"), surrounding (as in the St. Patrick lines), infusing the sprit (living in my heart) and even manifested in our beloved livestock!



**IPAC "We Are Still Here Speaker Series**: The Indigenous People's Allies Committee (IPAC) "We Are Still Here – Speaker Series" continues, on Sunday, **April 28**, from 10:45AM -12:00PM in Fellowship Hall. It will feature Dr. Marcus Lewis, discussing the "Impact of Ho-Chunk Boarding Schools." All are welcome to attend. Most people have heard of the Trail of Tears that five Native Nations suffered during the 1800s, but did you know there are similar stories that took place right here in Wisconsin? This presentation will discuss the numerous forced removals that the Ho-Chunk People endured from 1832 to 1865 and the Indian Boarding School period that followed. Dr. Lewis will share oral histories from Ho-Chunk Elders about the removals and the boarding schools. Attendees are encouraged to practice self-care during the presentation, as the topics and stories will be challenging.

Dr. Marcus Lewis has worked in diversity, equity, and inclusion for over a decade. He is a nationally trained Seeking Educational Equity and Diversity (SEED) facilitator and education leader. Dr. Lewis has dedicated his career to working in higher education and inclusive advocacy. He is also the owner and founder of Key Change Consulting, LLC, a firm dedicated to promoting inclusive excellence for education, business, and community organizations. Dr. Lewis and his family moved to the Fox Valley in 2021 and are members of First Congregational UCC.

We commit ourselves through study and immersion experiences to learn the history and cultures of these peoples and their traditional knowledge.
