Dear First Congregational members and friends,

Today's worship service offers two Christmas cantatas of Dietrich Buxtehude (ca. 1637-1707), famed Baroque organist, composer, and church musician. His *Abendmusiken* (evening concerts at Lübeck's *Marienkirche* on the five Sundays before Christmas) were well-known throughout Europe. J. S. Bach considered Buxtehude a major influence and journeyed over 200 miles (at age 20, the age of several of our LU Music Scholars!) from Arnstadt to hear him perform.

The first cantata we share today ("The Infant Jesus," sung in English) is one of the only instances where Buxtehude uses a hymn text without using the hymn tune as a unifying *cantus firmus*. Instead, he sets the text as a through-composed song, while still preserving its strophic form. Alternating the chorus with instrumental *ritornelli*, the work's text suggests that it may have first been performed for a New Year's service, as it celebrates the arrival of the Christ Child and the joy of starting a new year in the confidence of God's loving protection against enemies and suffering.

The second cantata, "In dulci jubilo" (with sweet rejoicing) is a setting of a *macaronic* carol (constantly alternating phrases between *two* languages -- Latin and German.) The alternating languages (and their accompanying sets of diction rules) have been an *exciting* challenge for our Sanctuary Choir (says their fearless director!) The work takes the form of a varied strophic chorale cantata (prominently using and embellishing the carol melody with each stanza), again in alternation with the strings and organ. Listen for the triumphant "trumpet fanfare figure" in the strings during the final stanza (and as it is used in the middle section of "The Infant Jesus," too.) This carol has been set by multiple generations of prominent composers, including the famed organ setting of J.S. Bach (which sometimes concludes our Christmas Eve services.) This morning's closing hymn, "Good Christians All, Rejoice!" invites us all to sing this beloved carol.

May today's service draw you closer to the Christ "with sweet rejoicing!" John Albrecht, *Director for Music Ministries*

### Land Covenant

The land now occupied by Appleton, Wisconsin and surrounding areas - including the current site of First Congregational UCC - was the home, hunting, gathering, and farming land of the First Peoples of this territory: the Ho Chunk Nation and the Menominee Nation.

Other tribes were forcibly re-located to this region by the actions of colonialism. Despite centuries of reprehensible treatment, the peoples of these sovereign nations are robust and enduring among us.

We are truly saddened by the genocide of their ancestors, the seizure of their lands, and the repression of their cultures and languages. We acknowledge that we benefit from the economic and social legacy left by settler colonialism.



We are grateful that many members of these original Nations have honorably served and defended the United States. We strive to honor their cultures and their insightful stewardship of this land and all creatures on it, recognizing our common interest in protecting its air, water, soils, and web of life for all future generations.

We commit ourselves through study and immersion experiences to learn the history and cultures of these peoples and their traditional knowledge.
