

IPAC "We Are Still Here Speaker Series: The Indigenous People's Allies Committee (IPAC) "We Are Still Here – Speaker Series" continues today, Sunday, **April 28**, from 10:45AM -12:00PM in Fellowship Hall. It will feature Dr. Marcus Lewis, discussing the "Impact of Ho-Chunk Boarding Schools." All are welcome to attend.

Most people have heard of the Trail of Tears that five Native Nations suffered during the 1800s, but did you know there are similar stories that took place right here in Wisconsin? This presentation will discuss the numerous forced removals that the Ho-Chunk People endured from 1832 to 1865 and the Indian Boarding School period that followed. Dr. Lewis will share oral histories from Ho-Chunk Elders about the removals and the boarding schools. Attendees are encouraged to practice self-care during the presentation, as the topics and stories will be challenging.

Dr. Marcus Lewis has worked in diversity, equity, and inclusion for over a decade. He is a nationally trained Seeking Educational Equity and Diversity (SEED) facilitator and education leader. Dr. Lewis has dedicated his career to working in higher education and inclusive advocacy. He is also the owner and founder of Key Change Consulting, LLC, a firm dedicated to promoting inclusive excellence for education, business, and community organizations. Dr. Lewis and his family moved to the Fox Valley in 2021 and are members of First Congregational UCC.

Land Covenant

The land now occupied by Appleton, Wisconsin and surrounding areas - including the current site of First Congregational UCC - was the home, hunting, gathering, and farming land of the First Peoples of this territory: the Ho Chunk Nation and the Menominee Nation.

Other tribes were forcibly re-located to this region by the actions of colonialism. Despite centuries of reprehensible treatment, the peoples of these sovereign nations are robust and enduring among us.

We are truly saddened by the genocide of their ancestors, the seizure of their lands, and the repression of their cultures and languages. We acknowledge that we benefit from the economic and social legacy left by settler colonialism.



We are grateful that many members of these original Nations have honorably served and defended the United States. We strive to honor their cultures and their insightful stewardship of this land and all creatures on it, recognizing our common interest in protecting its air, water, soil, and web of life for all future generations.

We commit ourselves through study and immersion experiences to learn the history and cultures of these peoples and their traditional knowledge.

We are "The Church of the Open Door," a welcoming and inclusive Christian community. No matter who you are or where you are on life's journey, you are welcome here.
