When the Sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of James and Salome bought spices, so that they might go and anoint him. God Will Dwell with Us!

On this Easter Sunday we gather to celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus Christ! We gather to hear the awesome story again, to learn to see the Resurrection in new ways and come to celebrate the new life we know through Jesus Christ. The Resurrection is attested throughout scripture, including this passage from Revelation 21:1-5:

Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth; for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and the sea was no more. And I saw the holy city, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband. And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "See, the home of God is among mortals. He will dwell with them as their God; they will be his peoples, and God himself will be with them; he will wipe every tear from their eyes. Death will be no more; mourning and crying and pain will be no more, for the first things have passed away."

And the one who was seated on the throne said, "See, I am making all things new."

The vision of prophecy found in Revelation is deeply powerful. God makes a way for God's beloved people in their homeland. They are exiled no more. They have famine no more. They weep no more. All the things they though impossible become possible through the gift of God's grace in Jesus Christ.

As a faith community today is another form on Resurrection: for the first time in many years, you have two permanent pastors in your midst. Today we welcome Rev. Katherine Willis Pershey into our midst, into our homeland, to share the voice that God has bestowed upon her with us. How blessed we are for this Resurrection of stability and continuity to the fabric of our community relationships, our worship, and service to witness a progressive Christian light to the Fox Valley.

For the first time since the founding of First Congregational in 1850, this church will now have co-pastors serving as its primary clergy leadership. We will continue to be blessed with the leadership of Pastor Dianne Droster, Directors John Albrecht and Sarah Wilterdink, and the rest of our talented and committee staff and extensive lay leadership. While none of us have the resurrecting abilities spoken of in Revelation which belong solely to our glorious creator God,

together we serve as symbols of God's presence in a challenging time for the institutional church in North America.

As this new partnership forms between us pastors and between you, our beloved church, we will write a series of messages meant to help all of us re-set our expectations for this new form of leadership. For whenever God does something new, something also must pass away. And we are all in this homeland together to learn to be a community of faith again.

In both our church community, and in our individual faith lives, we must practice deep trust in the renewing power of the Resurrection. May we dwell deeply in the prophet's words when he said, "He will dwell with them as their God; they will be his peoples, and God himself will be with them." We also must praise God for all the kinds of Resurrection that come to us, personally or corporately. Therefore, with shouts of joy and gladness of heart, may God be with you on this day of Resurrection!





