





She has already begun visiting members in hospitals and their homes. She will also engage with and encourage FCUCC committees that focus on visiting our members who cannot make it to church or who desire home visits for various reasons. We are blessed to have an additional staff member to help fill this very important ministry.

In CYF, we are grateful to have Dianne's knowledge and enthusiasm back as 'Pastor of Youth Ministries'. She will assist with the Children's Ministry, coordinate some special events and help us connect even more with our families. One of the most exciting parts about her joining us is that we can officially hold both Middle School and High School Youth Groups weekly for the rest of the year! She will work with our dedicated volunteers and me to continue providing God-filled and soul-filling Youth Group experiences.

As our church continues its path of collaboration and exciting growth, Dianne's part-time position is a blessing for both our members and our staff. Her presence fills two great needs – supporting some of our youngest and some of our oldest members. This yearly, renewable position gives us the stability and flexibility we need to be able to fulfil and re-evaluate our church's needs and staffing each program year.

What! No Newsletter?! What's Happening Now...

After a lengthy period of change, the FCUCC Staff, under the guidance of the Church Council and with pastoral input, has collaborated to re-assemble and implement communication procedures for First Congregational UCC. This is the evolving plan:

- 1. The hub of communication will be our website.
- 2. Weekly E-Newsletters will be sent out Mid-Week and on Fridays.
 - a. The Mid-Week e-news will be sent out late in the day on Tuesdays to provide updates about Wednesday evening activities.
 - b. The Friday e-news will provide the virtual version of the coming Sunday's "Open Door," which includes the weekly bulletin along with its attached announcements.
- 3. Look for us on social media.

Because of the information distribution process above, the monthly *physical* newsletter has been discontinued as of December 2023.

Land Covenant

The land now occupied by Appleton, Wisconsin and surrounding areas - including the current site of First Congregational UCC - was the home, hunting, gathering, and farming land of the First Peoples of this territory: the Ho Chunk Nation and the Menominee Nation.

Other tribes were forcibly re-located to this region by the actions of colonialism. Despite centuries of reprehensible treatment, the peoples of these sovereign nations are robust and enduring among us.

We are truly saddened by the genocide of their ancestors, the seizure of their lands, and the repression of their cultures and languages. We acknowledge that we benefit from the economic and social legacy left by settler colonialism.



We are grateful that many members of these original Nations have honorably served and defended the United States. We strive to honor their cultures and their insightful stewardship of this land and all creatures on it, recognizing our common interest in protecting its air, water, soils, and web of life for all future generations.

We commit ourselves through study and immersion experiences to learn the history and cultures of these peoples and their traditional knowledge.

We are "The Church of the Open Door," a welcoming and inclusive Christian community.

We're committed to tolerance, justice, and exploration - not dogma and rules.
