

In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, magi from the east came to Jerusalem, asking, "Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star in the east and have come to pay him homage."

When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him, and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. They told him, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for so it has been written by the prophet: 'And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah, for from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel." Then Herod secretly called for the magi and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child, and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage." When they had heard the king, they set out, and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen in the east, until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother, and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.

Introducing The Isaiah Corner: You've seen the banners and heard about all-church meetings and Task Forces, but many people are asking "What is The Isaiah Project?"



Here is our "elevator speech," a description of our work in a nutshell. Of course, there are a lot more details and efforts the elevator speech doesn't cover, but this gives everyone a basic idea.

When you hear "The Isaiah Project," think "infrastructure." The Steering Committee and four Task Forces are prayerfully engaged in research, community partnership development, and discernment to provide recommendations to Church Council about our buildings, grounds, and neighborhood presence. These recommendations will address our current and future needs and support our mission and priorities.

Now that our study and research and interviews are gelling into tangible updates, we are going to use a corner of the Open Door to communicate with you. Look for the logo. There will be a short update or announcement every week. Nancy Brown-Koeller, Isaiah Steering Committee.

<u>Library News</u>: Our theme for January is Peace and Reconciliation. Maybe you need some peace in your home or are stressed about the political environment. Come see the offerings in the library on the topic. Here are a couple titles: "Peace Is Every Step" by Nhat Hanh and "The Different Drum: Community-Making and Peace" by M. Scott Peck.

<u>Dry January</u>: Alcohol can be part of a joyful, balanced life. Whether it's sharing laughter with friends over a craft beer or savoring a glass of fine wine with dinner, these moments can bring pleasure and connection. However, our culture doesn't always encourage reflection or moderation when it comes to alcohol. Heavy drinking surged by about 20% during the pandemic and has not fallen. Dry January is a month-long break from consuming alcohol designed to offer physical, emotional, and spiritual benefits — benefits that are supported by medical research. If you feel that Dry January could be a positive reset for you this year, sign up to receive weekly emails from Pastor Katherine with encouragement, links, and prayers. *Please note: Dry January is not intended for those who are struggling with alcohol abuse disorder. If you're concerned about your alcohol or drug use, we encourage you to seek support as you begin your journey toward sobriety. 

Mental Health Spotlight: Next Sunday, January 12, our church will hold a congregational vote to accept our WISE (Welcoming, Inclusive, Supportive and Engaged) covenant, to demonstrate our commitment to mental health for all. Our Mental Health Task Force has spent the past two years exploring how to invite our church community to become WISE. We have offered educational presentations, suggested books on issues of mental health for the church library, organized teams for the local NAMI (National Alliance on Mental Illness) Walk and surveyed church members on wants and needs regarding mental health. We are excited to use the results of the survey in the coming year to offer more opportunities to support the congregation and provide further education about mental health issues.
