

About today's music. . .

Will Todd (b. 1970) is a UK-based performer and composer whose music spans a variety of styles and genres. Best known for his choral works, he has worked closely with choirs such as The Sixteen and Tenebrae, and his 2003 jazz mass setting *Mass in Blue* has been performed extensively by choirs in the UK, Europe and the USA. You may recall our local NEWVoices Choir performing the work with Janet Planet as soloist.

A *Missa Brevis* is simply an abbreviated setting of the *Mass Ordinary* that can take many forms. In today's case, the *Credo* movement is omitted – especially appropriate for us in the U.C.C. as a non-creedal church. This entire mass setting is less the 15 minutes in duration. Premiered in 2015, the *Jazz Missa Brevis* embraces a variety of jazz styles, from the swinging jazz waltz *Kyrie* to the up-beat Latin-groove *Gloria*. The smooth jazz ballad *Sanctus*, rollicking 7/8 *Benedictus* and the soulful *Agnus Dei* complete this setting.

Our prayer is that you will celebrate and enjoy our Christian story through this musical lens of contemporary jazz.

Book Discussion: *Thou Art That,* **by Joseph Campbell**: On **May 15**, First Congregational's Theology Discussion Group will begin discussing its next book, *Thou Art That,* by Joseph Campbell(2001, 192 pp). Best known for his comparative work in world mythology, in this collection of previously unpublished essays and lectures, Campbell delves into the Judeo-Christian tradition. Emphasizing the metaphorical (rather than literal-historical) meanings of key Judeo-Christian themes, he offers fresh interpretations informed by his extensive knowledge of world mythology. In this book, Campbell skillfully shows these metaphors to be pathways to deeper spiritual understanding and mystical insight. The essays range from rich storytelling to insightful comparative analysis, exhibiting Campbell's characteristic verve. If you enjoy reading and discussing good books on themes of religion, spirituality, justice, and growth in faith,



we invite you to join us on May 15 as Theo Group begins reading this new book together. Guidelines for Worship Service Announcements

➤ Generally, the pastor leading the worship service that week makes the announcement themselves. Exceptions are made.

> If the pastor cannot fit this request into worship, it will go into the bulletin, and the one making the request notified as time allows.
