

"A Journey of Belief"

Over the past nine months, fifteen confirmands and mentors have gathered multiple times each month to have conversation and dialogues about the Christian faith. Their conversations come from a curriculum we have adapted called *Way to Live: Christian Practices for Teenagers*. The goal of our time is to learn to be more aware of God's presence in all of our everyday lives and clarify our beliefs that direct how we are to live in our everyday life.

Here are some of these beliefs as they have been clarified over the past year, by the confirmands themselves. Enjoy the variety of places our young disciples stand in their journey of faith. Learn from them. Have hope in our mutual future that God is working through them and us as we all seek to refine the way in which we live in this world together.

Beliefs about God-

God is real, and he is there no matter what happens. At the end of the day, the most important thing is having a connection with God.

I have been familiar with God since a very young age. In Sunday school they always said he was our rock and our redeemer. I still believe this today. He is my rock. No matter the circumstance he is always here to listen.

I believe that God has made each and every one of us unique, and it's our job to use the gifts he has instilled in us.

Beliefs about Jesus-

I believe Jesus Christ is the son of God in human form. Jesus Christ is humble, and obedient. We see Jesus as a role model. We must serve others as he did.

I believe that Jesus Christ is our savior, sacrificing himself to save us from sins. He rose from the dead to show us the true powers of God, giving us real evidence of God's plan at work. He lived a holy life and to follow his example means to live a life filled with love and kindness. His resurrection gave the world joy, allowing me, many, many years later, to believe.

Jesus set the perfect example of how we, as Christians, are called to live with love, compassion, forgiveness, and faith in God. His life on earth was a model of selflessness

and service to others, from the way he treated the poor to how he responded to hatred with grace and patience. As followers of Christ, we strive to reflect these same qualities in our daily lives.

Beliefs about the Holy Spirit-

The Holy Spirit is with everybody, and lives inside of each and every one of us, to overall just live a better, more holy life.

I believe in the Holy Spirit; an intangible force that is part of God and resides within us all. I think that the Holy Spirit is what is inside of all of us that gives us the ability to do good things, such as charity or community work. I also believe that the Holy Spirit gives us all a deeper connection with God.

I believe that the Holy Spirit is a tangible thing that we can connect with in a place where we feel joy or peace. The Holy Spirit is real because I can feel it especially when I am up north fishing or hunting. I call it thin spaces; a thin space is a place where you feel very close and connected to the Holy Spirit or God. For me, it is up in northern Wisconsin, when I am by myself in nature.

Beliefs about the Church-

This church has always been a part of my life. I grew up in this community, and it has always been welcoming and kind to me in every part of my life, which I will always appreciate. Attending youth trips and volunteering with the church has taught me about the world and given me great memories. I am proud to be a part of an organization that does so much good for the community and hope it will continue to do even more great things.

I believe churches are a place where we are meant to carry out and spread God's message on earth. They are a place for communities to learn and grow together in their faith journeys. I also believe that churches are places where anyone can go if they ask for help, no matter their history of religion or beliefs.

I also think that our church brings people together and provides a safe place for many people. Everyone is welcome at our church and that is the reason that this is an amazing place to worship God.

Other Beliefs-

Faith means having a deep confidence and trust in the things you hope for, even though you cannot see them yet.

I believe that it is important to share this faith with those around you.

God performs miracles, small and large. Some we don't notice, while others have lasting impacts on our lives.

So, what would your faith statement include beyond God, Jesus, the Holy Spirit and the church? What other beliefs or concepts might be important to define and include? What would you leave out? Where can you stand firm in a specific belief and where might you be unsure and have doubt?

It has been a privilege leading this confirmation group once again, and I praise God for all our mentors, parents, and congregational support that made it happen!





Land Covenant

The land now occupied by Appleton, Wisconsin and surrounding areas - including the current site of First Congregational UCC - was the home, hunting, gathering, and farming land of the First Peoples of this territory: the Ho Chunk Nation and the Menominee Nation. Other tribes were forcibly re-located to this region by the actions of colonialism. Despite centuries of reprehensible treatment, the peoples of these sovereign nations are robust and enduring among us.

We are truly saddened by the genocide of their ancestors, the seizure of their lands, and the repression of their cultures and languages. We acknowledge that we benefit from the economic and social legacy left by settler colonialism.

We are grateful that many members of these original Nations have honorably served and defended the United States. We strive to honor their cultures and their insightful stewardship of this land and all creatures on it, recognizing our common interest in protecting its air, water, soils, and web of life for all future generations.
